Your Directors have pleasure in presenting their Twenty Seventh Report along with the Audited Financial Statements of the Company for the year ending March 31, 2020

OPERATIONS:

During the period under review, the Operating Income of the company has increased to Rs. 1820.71 Lakhs from Rs.1693.34 Lakhs in the Financial Year 2019-20, as compared to the previous year income. The Company has suffered a loss of Rs.26.43 Lakhs as compared to the last year profit of Rs. 4.68 Lakhs. This is mainly on account of increase in operational cost which the company could not recover in its receipts.

Your Company accords to providing a good quality and affordable healthcare services to all its patients. During this year under review the Company has started providing food to the patients to maintain a level of hygiene and healthy food intake of its patients. Your Company's stringent medical process and protocol are designed to deliver superior clinical outcomes and enhance patient satisfaction.

HOSPITAL ACCREDITATION

Your Hospital has been pre-entry certified by National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare providers (NABH) for the delivery of high standards for safety and quality care to the patients.

In accordance with Section 134(3)(a) of the Companies Act, 2013, the extract of the Annual Return for the Financial Year 2019-20 in Form No. MGT – 9 is annexed herewith in "Annexure B" to this report. STATEMENT OF DECLARATION BY INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS:

The Company has received necessary declaration form all Independent Directors of the Company that they meet the criteria of independence as laid down under Section 149(6) of the Act and Regulation 16(1) (b) of the Listing Regulations. In the opinion of the Board, the Independent Directors, fulfil the conditions of independence specified in Section 149(6) of the Act and Regulation 16(1) (b) of the Listing Regulations.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE:

Your Company has a Paid Up Share Capital of Rs. 409.84 Lakhs and the net worth of Rs. 1045.84 Lakhs during the financial year ending 31.03.2020. Hence, Regulation 27(2) of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulation, 2015 are not applicable on the Company and your Company is not required to report on the Corporate Governance. However, your company has made every effort to comply with the provisions of the Corporate Governance and to see that the interest of the shareholders and the Company are properly served.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS:

In terms of the provision of Regulation 34(2)(e) read with Schedule V of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, Management Discussion & Analysis Report, for the financial year under review, is presented in a separate section forming part of the Annual Report. This report is also annexed herewith as "Annexure-C".

DIVIDEND& RESERVES:

Keeping in view the losses for the year under review, the Board of Directors has decided not to recommend any dividend for the financial year ended March 31, 2020. Accordingly, there has been no transfer to general reserves.

Your Company did not have any funds lying unpaid or unclaimed for a period of 7(seven) years. Therefore, there were no funds, which were required to be transferred to Investor Education Protection Fund (IEPF). Pursuant to the provisions of the Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (Accounting, Audit, Transfer and Refund) Amendment Rules, 2017 ('Revised Rules'), the Company was not required to file any form with the Ministry of Corporate Affairs.

SHARE CAPITAL:

The paid up equity share capital as on March 31, 2020 was Rs.409.84 Lakh. During the year under review, the Company has neither issued shares with differential voting rights nor granted stock options and sweat equity.

The Company's business was significantly impacted from February 2020 as a result of the increasing spread of the COVID-19 pandemic. This became more pronounced in the last week of March 2020. The lockdown witnessed a considerable drop in hospital occupancy. Impact of Covid – 19 Pandemic is rapidly spreading throughout the world.

Your Company as a prime healthcare service provider has taken all standard, mandatory and precautionary protections as per the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and Government of Uttar Pradesh to ensure that the Doctors, Nurses, Staff and Para Medical Team and all patients are safe. Hygiene procedures like Wearing Face Masks, Using Hand Wash / Rub and Social Distancing was implemented extensively across the Hospital.

Your company was able to run the limited operations with great difficulties as it implemented the preventive safeguard measures as an abundant caution much before the guidelines were issued by the Central/State governments. Due to the restrictions from Central/State as to health services to be provided and on limitation of the manpower and social distancing norms, we experienced limited operations and bed occupancy in the hospital. Though there was not total disruption of operations due to COVID-19, but still we believe that it impact the revenue due to reasons quoted above. The major impact of lowering of the revenue would be seen in Q1 of F.Y. 2020-21 and this may not be material in the next quarter.

However, the impact assessment of COVID-19 is a continuing process given the uncertainties associated with its nature and duration and accordingly the impact may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements. The Company will continue to monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

Management Discussion and Analysis Report as required under regulation 34 read with Schedule V of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, is as under:

INDIAN HEALTHCARE SECTOR: AN OVERVIEW

Healthcare is one of India's largest sectors both in terms of revenue and employment. Healthcare comprises hospitals, medical devices, pharmaceutical, clinical trials, telemedicine, medical tourism, health insurance and diagnostics. The Indian healthcare delivery system is categorised into two major components - public and private. The Government, i.e. public healthcare system comprises limited secondary and tertiary care institutions in key cities and provides basic healthcare through primary healthcare centres (PHCs) in rural areas. The private sector provides majority of secondary, tertiary and quaternary care institutions with a major concentration in metros, tier I and tier II cities.

The Indian Healthcare Industry continues to be characterised by strong growth drivers of our country such as rising income levels, ageing population, growing health awareness and changing attitude towards preventive healthcare; we believe these are compelling reasons for the increase in healthcare services demand in the future. The COVID- 19 pandemic is expected to further accelerate this demand for healthcare services. In addition, low cost and better value driven outcomes has resulted in the rise in the country's medical tourism, attracting patients from across the world.

GLOBAL ECONOMY BEING IMPACTED DUE TO COVID-19

The COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted global supply chains and international trade. With over 200 countries closing national borders during April & May 2020, the movement of people and tourism flows have come to a halt. According to United Nations (UN), it is being estimated that the global economy could shrink by up to 1% in 2020 due to the pandemic, a reversal from the previous forecast of 2.5% growth. The Global economy may contract even further if restrictions on the economic activities are extended without adequate fiscal responses.

COVID-19 - IMPACT ON INDIA AND THE ECONOMY

India announced a nationwide lockdown on Mar 24, 2020 to control the spread of Covid – 19 and began easing lockdown restrictions after a month and a half in the beginning of May. The effect of the state-wide lockdowns/ curfews and the national level lockdown has been a closure of all commercial and private establishments and suspension of all transportation services (save and except transportation involving movement of essential goods and services).

Most multilateral agencies and credit rating agencies have revised their 2020 and 2021 growth projections for India keeping in view the negative impact of coronavirus-induced travel restrictions, supply chain disruptions, subdued consumption and investment levels on the growth of both global and the Indian economy. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) reduced its FY21 growth projection for India to 1.9% from 5.8% projected in January 2020.

SEGMENT WISE/COMPANY WISE PERFORMANCE

The Company is engaged mainly in the segment of providing Medical & Health-care Services to the public at large.

OUTLOOK AND COMPANY OVERVIEW

The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and consequent nationwide lockdown and other restrictions imposed by the government on movement across the country since March 24, 2020 is expected to severely affect the economic growth during FY 2020-21, especially in the first quarter.

Notes Forming Part of Financial Statements

Note: 1

Background of the Company

Dhanvantri Jeevan Rekha Ltd. is a company listed with Mumbai Stock Exchange providing diagnostic and therapeutic services and has extended its scope of diagnostic and hospital services by providing a fully operational Cath Lab, catering to higher end needs of the cardiac patients including Angiography, Angioplasty, Pacemaker Implantation, Valvuloplasty etc. In these financial statements, current year figures are from April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020 (2019-2020). Previous year figures are from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 (2018-2019). The functional and reporting currency of the Company is Indian Rupees.

Note: 2. Significant Accounting Policy

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial information

- a) The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") and disclosures thereon comply with the requirements of IND-As, stipulations contained in Schedule-III (revised) as applicable under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules 2014, Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015 as amended form time to time, other pronouncement of ICAI, provisions of the Companies Act and Rules and guidelines issued by SEBI as applicable.
- b) The financial statements have been prepared on going concern basis in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in India. The presentation of financial statement is based on Ind AS Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013.
- c) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention on accrual basis.

2.2 Historical Cost Convention

The financial statements are prepared on accrual basis of accounting under historical cost convention in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in India and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 including Indian Accounting Standards notified there under, except for certain financial instruments which are measured at fair values at the end of each reporting period, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for goods and services.

- i. Defined benefit plan-plan assets measured at fair value.
- ii. Certain financial assets and liabilities.

2.3 Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles which require the management of the Company to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities at the end of the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon the management's best knowledge of current events and actions, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in the outcomes requiring a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets or liabilities in future period. Appropriate changes in estimates are made as management becomes aware of changes in circumstances surrounding the estimates.

2.4 Current versus non-current classification

The entity presents assets and liabilities in the balance sheet based on current/ non-current classification:

An asset is classified as current, when:

a) It is expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle. b) It is held primarily for the purpose of trading. c) It is expected to be realised within twelve months after the reporting period, or d) It is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current, when:

a) It is expected to be settled in normal operating cycle. b) It is held primarily for the purpose of trading. c) It is due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period, or d) There is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting period. The entity classifies all other liabilities as non-current. Deferred tax assets and liabilities

2.5 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Valuation of Inventories

Consumables etc. are valued at lower of the cost or net realizable value applying the First in First out Method (FIFO).

b) Depreciation

Depreciation on Tangible fixed assets other than land is charged on straight line method so as to write off the cost/carrying amount of assets. The useful life of assets as prescribed under Part C of Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013 and depreciation is charged on that are on the following basis:

- Depreciation on All Assets is charged at Straight Line Method basis in the manner as prescribed in Companies Act 2013 and rate as per prescribed useful life
- 2. Intangible assets are amortized over a period of 5 year on a straight line basis.

2.6 Recognition of Income & Expenses

All items of Incomes and expenses have been accounted for on accrual basis.

Borrowing Cost

Borrowing Costs attributable to acquisition and construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as a part of the cost of such asset up to the date when such assets is ready for its intended use.

Other borrowing costs are charged to the Profit & Loss Account.

Revenue Recognition

The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties and in accordance with accounting standards applicable.

Provisions

Provisions are recognized in the accounts in respect of present probable obligations, the amount of which can be reliably estimated.

Retirement Benefits

Defined Contribution Plans

The Company makes contributions towards provident fund and employee state insurance to a defined contribution retirement benefit plan for qualifying employees. Under the plan, the Company is required to contribute a specified percentage of payroll cost to the retirement benefit plan to fund the benefits.

The amount recognized as an expense towards contribution to Provident Fund and Employee State Insurance for the year aggregated to Rs. 16,20,649/- (previous year: Rs. 11,54,991/-)

Defined Benefit Plan

Gratuity: The Company operates post-employment defined benefit plan that provide gratuity. The gratuity plan entitles an employee, who has rendered at least five years of continuous service, to receive one-half month's salary for each year of completed service at the time of retirement/exit. The Company is paying gratuity to all its employees who are eligible and the same is computed in accordance with the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972. The Company is in process to get the Group Gratuity Scheme with the Life Insurance Corporation of India to cover the Liability in respect of Gratuity to employees.

The Company's obligation in respect of the gratuity plan, which is a defined benefit plan, is provided for based on actuarial valuation carried out by an independent actuary using the projected unit credit method. The Company recognizes actuarial gains and losses immediately in the statement of profit and loss.

Leave Encashment: As determined on the basis of accumulated leave in the credit of employee as at the year end.
